

Pray that our church would experience real and abiding rest and restoration in Jesus.

Psalm 23:1-3 – The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul.

Pray for boldness and wisdom as we bring the Gospel to every table, and for many people to surrender to and trust in Jesus this year.

Colossians 4:5-6 – And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

Pray for families who have lost a loved one and this season is especially difficult.

Psalm 34:18 – “The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.”

Matthew 5:4 – “Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.”

Pray for the first-time guests who will show up to The Bridge in 2025

Romans 15:7 – “Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you.”

Psalms 68:6 – “God sets the lonely in families.”

Pray for complete freedom from addictions for the people of our church and community

Romans 6:5-7 – If we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin— because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.

Pray for our brothers and sisters in Maury and Perry County Jail

Hebrews 13:3 – “Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them.”

Matthew 25:36 – “I was in prison and you came to me.”

Pray for the broken marriages in our church to find hope, healing, and redemption through Jesus

Colossians 3:13 – “Bear with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgive each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.”

Pray for the “next gen” of our church

1 Timothy 4:12 – “Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example.”

Psalms 78:4-7 – “We will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord...so the next generation would know them.”

Pray for Bridge Worship, that these songs would continue to impact others and make much of Jesus

Colossians 3:16 – “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another...singing psalms and hymns.”

Psalms 96:1-3 – “Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.”

Pray for our local leaders, business owners, public officials, and teachers

1 Timothy 2:1-2 – “I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions.”

Proverbs 11:14 – “Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety.”

Pray for our staff and the families of our staff to have health, renewed energy, faith, and passion for God’s Kingdom

Colossians 1:9-11 For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience,

Pray for the kids of our church to encounter God in new and powerful ways
